### MEANING OF C3

- Community-centered curriculum is approach that connects classroom learning objectives with civic engagement.
- Civic engagement occurs through service that meets community-identified needs or through research and experience that holds promise of social or scientific value to the community.

### MEANING OF C<sup>3</sup>

 In this mutually beneficial process, students are able to gain a deeper understanding of course content by integrating theory with practice, while communities gain access to volunteers, resources, and the wide-ranging research and scholarly expertise housed in the College's many disciplinary departments.
