- o Very Dense: All lands with tree canopy density of 70% and above
- o Moderately Dense: All lands with tree canopy of 40% and more but less than 70%
- Open Forest: All lands with tree canopy of 10% and more but less than 40%
- o Shrubs: Degraded forest lands with canopy less than 10%

- o Non Forest: No forest area
- ✓ **Canopy**: Canopy refers to the upper layer or habitat zone formed by the mature trees crowns and including other biological organisms.
