- The first major challenge in research process lies in choosing a topic
- Identification and formulation of research problem is the first step of a research process
- Problem formulation is like an identification of a destination before undertaking the journey
- If it is well formulated, you can expect a good study to follow
- The research problem serves as a foundation of a research study

Summary of the Criteria of A Good Research Problem

- 1. The problem is significant
 - (it will contribute to the body of knowledge in education)
- 2. The problem is one that will lead to further research
- 3. The problem is researchable (it can be investigated through the collection of data)
- 4. The problem is suitable
 - (it is interesting and suits the researcher's skill, time and available resources)
- 5. The problem is ethical
 - (it will not cause harm to subjects)

There is no shortcut to research. One has to go through every phase of it in detail.

Often student researchers hastily skip the stage of choosing and formulating a research problem of borrowing or initiating a title which is wrongly presumed to be a research problem and then face difficulties later.
